

Jan Tøssebro (PhD), professor emeritus in Social Work at the Norwegian University of Science and Technology. His involvement in disability research goes back to the 1980s, and include topics such as deinstitutionalisation, disability policy, families, growing up with disability, employment and living conditions. He has studied the development of services for persons with intellectual disabilities in Norway since the closure of all institutions entered the political agenda in the late 1980s, using comparable data spanning more than three decades. Most of his research is in the intersection between social science and disability politics. He has taken part in several public committees on disability policy, including the drafting of anti-discrimination legislation. He chaired the national Disability Council for four years and was a member of the Norwegian Equality and Discrimination Tribunal. He has personal experiences as a father of a man with autism and learning disabilities.
